A note from the wardens...

Saint George's said a fond farewell to Revd Penny on 30th January – thank you to everyone who helped to make her last day with us special.

Penny came to us in January 2020 – little did she know that it would be the start of an extremely rocky journey!

Six weeks after her arrival, the country went into lockdown – Penny immediately rallied the troops. She brought together a small group of volunteers to create packs for the parish, which contained messages of hope, details of how Penny could be contacted and a little gift. In addition, she asked for volunteers to keep in touch with everyone on the electoral role, so that we could ensure everyone was looked after and knew that someone cared. Offers of shopping, collecting prescriptions, pastoral visits (standing on the doorstep) and friendships were made.

Along with her husband, Father David, Penny held numerous online services and introduced virtual coffee mornings where we could meet virtually for a chat and fellowship.

Nobody expected the pandemic to still be here in February 2022, but Penny has made it easier for a lot of us.

Now that restrictions are easing, many of our groups have re-started. The tots group is busier than ever before, Rainbows, Brownies and Guides are running around spreading their smiles and enthusiasm, the Dementia Café has welcomed more friends, the Thursday come together café is extremely popular and George's kitchen has now got in excess of 30 customers.

Our relationship with the wider community is developing, and with everyone's help, this will continue.

The Church is not a building, it is the people.

Many of the congregation filled in 'Time and Talents' forms last year, these have not been forgotten!

If you indicated that you would like to help with aspects of Church life, we will be in touch. If you did not fill in a form, or on reflection, you feel that you could offer more help, please be in touch. You are not standing on any one's toes, and you are definitely needed. Likewise, if you think your offers of help have been overlooked, please be in touch.

It will come as no surprise that there will be a few changes now that Penny has left. The wardens will endeavour to do all we can to ensure that worship and ministry continues as much as possible.

We have a number of visiting clergy arranged, Junior Church will take a bigger part in Worship For All services, and we have visiting organists to aid with our worship. Unfortunately, the Tuesday morning Eucharist service will no longer be possible.

COVID 19 UPDATE

If you have any questions, queries or concerns, please contact the Churchwardens.

Face coverings are no longer mandatory from this week but are encouraged, especially when moving around the building.

Social distancing Distancing is no longer mandated. Therefore, there is no general numerical restriction on attendance at any service, including baptisms, weddings, and funerals. Everyone attending church is encouraged to use the whole building and to respect the space of others. The central pews in the nave are now in full use. The side aisles will remain distanced for those who wish to remain distanced.

Hymns are now sung on Sundays at 10.30am.

You are encouraged to ensure that you are well spaced around the church. You may choose to wear a face covering when singing.

Please continue to leave your **collection** on the plate at the back of church. It will be presented at the offertory.

The peace may be shared physically amongst those who wish but please share only with those in your pew. If you do not wish to share the peace physically, please wave the peace instead to indicate this!

Holy Communion continues to be received standing and using the one-way system still in place in church. You are encouraged to sanitise your hands before receiving. Church of England guidance now permits receiving Holy Communion in both kinds (i.e. bread and wine) The chalice will be available for those who wish to receive it. No intinction (dipping wafers).





All in the month of February

It was:

175 years ago, on 11th Feb 1847 that Thomas Edison was born. Best known for inventing the first practical incandescent light bulb, phonograph, movie camera and projector, and many more.

100 years ago, on 8th Feb 1922 that the first radio was installed in the White House.

Also 100 years ago, on 28^{th} Feb 1922 that Egypt gained its independence from the UK.

80 years ago, on 8th Feb 1942 that the Battle of Singapore took place. The Japanese then occupied Singapore until September 1945. This is regarded as the worst disaster in British military history, with about 80,000 British, Indian and Australian troops captured.

75 years ago, on 7th Feb 1947 that the first of the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in caves in Khirbat Qumran (now in the West Bank, Palestine).

70 years ago, on 6th Feb 1952 that Princess Elizabeth ascended the throne following the death of her father, King George VI.

65 years ago, on 16th Feb 1957 that the Toddlers' Truce was abolished in Britain. During the Truce, television channels closed down for an hour so that young children could be put to bed. Children's programming ended at 6pm and adult programming began at 7pm.

60 years ago, on 20th Feb 1962 that John Glenn became the first American astronaut to orbit the Earth. He made three orbits in the space capsule *Friendship 7.*

50 years ago, on 9th Feb 1972 the British Government declared a state of emergency over the miners' strike which began in January. From 16th February, electricity supplies to homes and businesses were cut off for up to nine hours a day. The strike ended on 25th February.

Also 50 years ago, on 18th Feb 1972 that the House of Commons voted narrowly in favour (by eight votes) of joining the Common Market (EU)

30 years ago, on 20th Feb 1992 that the English Premier League was founded, superseding the first division of the Football League.

25 years ago, on 13th Feb 1997 that an inquest into the death of black British teenager Stephen Lawrence ended. The jury decided that he had been unlawfully killed by five white youths, but they were not convicted. Two of the perpetrators were eventually convicted in January 2012, and sentenced to 15 years and 14 years in prison.

Also 25 years ago, on 22nd Feb 1997 that scientists successfully cloned a mammal for the first time: a sheep named Dolly.
