

ST GEORGE'S CHURCH DEMENTIA CAFÉ



I just wanted to give you an update on what's happening at the Dementia Café! I am thrilled to say that we are going from strength to strength. We have up to 22 visitors plus Volunteers, but by the very nature of the disease we never really know how

many guests to expect until we open the door! With all the will in the world a carer may plan to bring their loved one but have a 'difficult' time with them and are unable to come at the last minute. This is a challenge when we plan to serve a lunch but I always pack everyone off with a Doggy bag at the end!

Our entertainment has varied tremendously. They love a good quiz – which surprises a lot of people. We have had Armchair Aerobics which went down a treat – they were singing along as they did a great job of doing the exercises! Music is an important part of life for someone living with Dementia and so we held a Musical Memories day. The idea was to let us know of a song which sparked a particular memory and then share that memory with us. It didn't quite work out like that – they were too busy singing and dancing (!) to do much talking! Frank Sinatra, Matt Munro, Elvis were a few of the favourites.

The ability of our guests varies tremendously but we do all we can to make it an inclusive meeting time. We have received a grant from the Big Local Lottery Fund which provided us with mugs with handles which were easier to hold and cutlery which has better grip handles. They also provided a variety of games — Play Your Cards Right, Target Golf, Animal Bingo together with a reference book, the Caregivers Guide to Dementia which is available as a reference for any of our carers. Other grants have enabled us to buy Carpet Bowls (which we played up the aisle!), Bar skittles and dominoes (a firm favourite).

The guests have developed bonds within the group and I have set up a WhatsApp group for them. If anyone has a question or problem they simply pop it on the WhatsApp group and it is surprising how many then jump on to offer support, advice or just a listening ear. I think that they feel that they are not alone in their struggles.

Our future plans include A Sports Day, a trip to Portland Basin with lunch and a trip to Stamford Park for Picnic in the Park (weather permitting!)

My thanks must go to the loyal band of volunteers without whom none of this would be possible. The pleasure we get from seeing all our guests have such a great time is immeasurable and I always come away with a little tear in my eye! Welcoming Families

Since our recent article asking for help at church for life events such as baptisms, weddings and funerals we have had a few enquiries about what is actually involved in helping at these services, so we thought it would be helpful if we gave a brief explanation.

Baptisms

We are trying to allocate these to the first and third Sunday of the month.

So - what's involved?

- Set up Church for the baptism this requires:
 - * Placing a jug of warm water near the font
 - * Set a table up with a white cloth, candles and Baptism cards
 - * Put service sheets on pews
 - * Check that the sound system is switched on
 - * Light the candles on the altar, and the baptism candles
- Welcome the family and guests
- Count the number of adults and children
- Put any offertory received into a bank bag, label (e.g. baptism on 6th Feb), and leave, along with the head count, on the desk in the vestry
- Smile
- Check if the visiting vicar needs anything
- Lock up once everyone has left

Weddings

So - what's involved?

- Be the first there to open up
- Set up Church for the wedding this requires:
 - * Put 'No parking' cones up outside Church
 - * Light candles
 - * Put service sheets on pews
 - * Check that the sound system is turned on
- Welcome the family and guests
- · Check if the groom or family need anything
- When the bride arrives, indicate to the vicar that she has arrived and close the wooden doors leading into the lounge

- Check with the vicar what they prefer some will welcome the guests, then walk down to chat with the bride, others will welcome the guests then stay there – just take their lead
- Count the number of adults and children
- Put any offertory received into a bank bag, label (e.g. wedding on 6th Feb), and leave it, along with the head count, on the desk in the vestry
- Smile
- Check if the visiting vicar needs anything
- Lock up once everyone has left

Funerals

So - what's involved?

- Set up Church for the funeral this requires:
 - * Put 'no parking' cones out at the front of church
 - * Put service sheets on pews
 - * Check that the sound system is switched on
- Welcome the family and guests
- Be available if the family need anything
- Count the number of adults and children
- Put any offertory received into a bank bag, label (e.g. funeral on 6th Feb), and leave it, along with the head count, on the desk in the vestry
- Check if the visiting vicar needs anything
- Lock up once everyone has left

For those who do not have keys, we will have a 'stewards set' available which you can then put in the Church post box.

If there is anything more you wish to know, please have a word with Val or Gillian. If you would like one of us to be with you for the first service, please let us know – we are here if you need anything.

10th July brings us Sea Sunday, the day when Christian churches remember, pray and give thanks for the more than 1.5 million merchant seafarers and fishermen worldwide. If seafarers seem irrelevant to your daily life, think again: 90 per cent of everything you buy in the shops comes to you by sea. Merchant seafarers quite literally keep our global economy afloat. Yet it is a tough life, far from loved ones. Merchant ships are harsh working environments, never mind the threat of piracy or even shipwreck.

To help the seafarers, a worldwide network of port chaplains has sprung up. They offer hospitality and friendship, as well as practical, emotional and spiritual support, providing almost a 'home from home' in hundreds of ports, in more than 50 countries. You might wish to support one of these three well-known societies: The Mission to Seafarers (Anglican), The Apostolate of the Sea (Roman Catholic), and The Sailors' Society (inter-denominational).



National 'Don't Step on a Bee Day' – 10th July—yes, really!

Bees need your help. And we need their help.



The majority of our honey here in the UK is imported (85%), but there are also many beekeepers on our doorstep. So why not visit a near-by farm shop or deli and enjoy the precious produce of local beekeepers for breakfast?

You can also help bees by planting wildflower seeds that will provide a food supply. Download the Great British Bee Count app created by Friends of the Earth which allows you to log the bees you spot out and about. This builds a picture of bee health and activity in the UK. Finally, build a bee hotel! Bees need somewhere to rest when they venture out on their pollen mission. You can find a step-by-step


As we are part of the same Mission Community with St George's, Mossley this will be a good way to socialise and get to know one another.
