Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Do you have favourite story or character or verse from Scripture? Although we take all of God's word seriously and try to learn from it, some people or miracles or lines from the Bible can come to mean more to us than others. One of my favourite phrases at the moment is from the Letter to the

Hebrews: 'since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses.' The writer is encouraging the readers to think about all those people of faith who have lived lives which honoured God, and who tried to live according to God's will despite the many difficulties and persecutions they underwent. This is meant to be an inspiration for the readers and for us.

None of us can be Christians in isolation. We all need the support and love of other people not only in our lives generally but in our faith as well. We ourselves can be an inspiration and support to others, although we may not always know it.

The writer of Hebrews cites many famous heroes and prophets as men and women to whom the readers can look for examples of faith, commitment and endurance, and whom they might emulate in their own lives. Very few of us are called to suffer as some Christians have in the past and continue to do in many countries across the world, but we are called to live lives of commitment and discipline, worship and prayer.

So, I wonder who you look to as a Christian, as someone who best demonstrates the loving service, compassion and faith which is God's will? I also wonder where you draw the energy and empowerment you need to live your faith day-to-day? One place I hope is in our churches where worship continues Sunday after Sunday, and where as the writer of Hebrews says, we know that we are part of a large community not just in Mossley, Roughtown and Stalybridge but across the world. That praying, worshipping, serving community is the 'cloud of witnesses' which the writer of Hebrews knew was so important for sustaining and encouraging our own faith. Gathering together as people of God is so important for ourselves and others. It enables us to witness to the world, and our neighbours and friends about the love of God and the hope we find in Christ.

Who do you look to in your 'cloud of witnesses' and who might look to you to be in theirs?

Parish Share

(Money, Money, Money)

In July, I along with our treasurer Andrew, met with two representatives from St John's House (the Diocese) to discuss our parish share. We were originally asked for a contribution of £34,157 for 2024 which would have been a real struggle for us to meet. However, at the meeting a new figure of £17,500 was agreed for this year (agreed with some persuasion it has to be said!)

As you can see this is a substantial reduction from the previous sum and one which the PCC have already agreed to. I have to say that I'm grateful to Carolyn and Richard who were the Diocesan reps for their understanding and willingness to listen.

We very much want to make sure that we pay the new parish share in full and that's where you can all help. Our financial donation to the work of the church isn't only a practical thing to keep the church going and to support the mission of the church across the Diocese, it is actually our generous response to God's generosity to us. Our regular giving to the church should reflect our love for God and all that he has done for us.

I wonder when you last increased your regular gift? If you currently give £5 per week, could you increase it to £6 or £7? If you give £10, could you make it £12 or £13, etc.? A small increase would make a big difference to our income, especially if you're also able to gift aid.

Education Sunday

Education Sunday takes place on 8th September, as our children return to school after the summer break. It's good opportunity to ask what God thinks of children and how we can reflect this in our schools, churches and families.

Children are valuable to God:

'Then people brought little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples rebuked them. Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.' (Matthew 19:13-14).

Jesus' action shows the importance of children to God. In many cultures around the world, children are often abused, exploited or disregarded. God is committed to caring and protecting them and calls us to do the same.

Children need nurture and guidance:

'Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it.' (Proverbs 22:6 ESV). Gardeners will often attach plants to a pole or trellis to guide their growth. Children also need solid structure to keep their physical, emotional, social, and spiritual growth on track. We can support them in their growth and development, and we can be a godly example to them.

Children need discipline:

'Discipline your children, and they will give you peace; they will bring you the delights you desire.' (Proverbs 29:17). This is not easy and requires the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). Discipline is a sign of love, reflecting how God deals with us (Hebrews 12:7). In this way, they'll become adults who fulfil all that the Creator wants them to become.

As Jesus said, 'Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me' (Mark 9:37).




