

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Well, Lent is here, and I wonder if you've been thinking about how you might observe it? Will you give something up, chocolate, cakes etc? Or will you take something up, extra prayer time or coming to a Lent course?

I'm hoping to spend more time in silent prayer each day if possible, but certainly four or five times a week.

Silence is something I've spoken to my spiritual companion about a lot in our meetings, and I feel it's time to take this kind of prayer more seriously. Lent is a serious time. It is the one time in the year when we're strongly encouraged to consider discipline and its place in our lives. Here are some words from the Ash Wednesday Liturgy, 'I invite you... to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word.'

All of the things listed here are spiritual disciplines and are a means for us to draw closer to God. In the list we see again how a physical or practical discipline can be used to as an outward focus to our inner spiritual growth.

Silence isn't the only discipline I'll be undertaking during Lent; I'll also be undertaking some self-denial and fasting disciplines too. It will be a challenge of course, but that's partly the point. The other point or purpose is to recognise where I/we have strayed from the Lord and to make sure we are doing what we can to realign ourselves with God.

So, I pray that you'll have a holy Lent. I pray that you'll know God's presence and draw closer to Him and I pray that through those Lenten disciplines Easter, when it comes, will be more joyful than ever.



Grave Tidy Service


While we try to keep all of the graveyard clean and tidy all year round, it is getting to that time of year when everything seems to spring up! So we offer a grave tidy and

2025 - time for a new Church Flectoral Roll

This is the year when EVERYONE gets dumped off the Electoral Roll — and needs to make a definite decision to come back on again.

It happens in the Church of England every six years. Whereas for five years, the Electoral Roll is revised annually by our Electoral Roll Officer, in this sixth year, the roll is dissolved, and we must all re-apply and re-commit ourselves.

If you manage to wade through all the details of the process, and understand them, it will leave you with admiration for the person in our church who has been brave enough to become the Electoral Roll Officer!




General matters

- The only Churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and
 certain foreign Churches, as listed in the Supplementary Material to the Canons (but note <u>Rule 83(3)</u> of the
 Church Representation Rules, which provides for any question as to whether a particular Church is in
 communion with the Church of England to be decided by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York acting
 jointly).
- Membership of the electoral roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church of England.
- 3. Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can reapply. If you are not resident in the parish but were on the roll as a habitual worshipper and have been prevented by illness or other sufficient cause from worshipping for the past six months, you should complete declaration 2B or 2C as follows
 - (a) delete the first set of words in square brackets and
 - (b) at the end of the second set of words in square brackets, briefly state the reason for not having worshipped as mentioned.
- 4. If you have any problems with this Form, please approach the clergy or lay people responsible for the parish, who will be pleased to help you.
- 5. In this Form 'parish' means ecclesiastical parish.

Use of email addresses and other personal data

- 6. You do not have to provide an email address on this Form. If you do provide one, the Parochial Church Council and the electoral roll officer are entitled to use that email address to communicate with you in connection with the maintenance or revision of the Roll or the preparation of a new Roll or with elections to or membership of the Council.
- 7. The Church Representation Rules impose certain requirements for your name and address to be given to a third party, such as the diocesan electoral registration officer, in connection with elections to or membership of a deanery synod, diocesan synod or the House of Laity of the General Synod. If you provide an email address on this Form, it will be given to the third party along with your postal address.
- 8. A third party to whom your name and address have been given under the Church Representation Rules is in certain cases required by the Rules to pass them on to another person, such as the presiding officer in a synodical election. If you provide an email address on this Form, that email address will be given to the other person along with your postal address.
- 9. Any person to whom your email address or other personal data is given under the Church Representation Rules is required by those Rules to hold the data securely. Furthermore, if you do provide an email address on this Form, that does not give anybody the right to use it for any purpose other than those permitted by the Rules; so it cannot, for example, be used for social matters or fund-raising.
- 10. The roll is published after each annual revision and after the preparation of a new roll. The published roll will include your name (as well as the name of every other person on the roll) but none of your other personal data (as defined by the Data Protection Act 2018) will be made public as a result of your inclusion on the roll.

Why Do We Do That?



Have you noticed how when Holy Communion has been distributed, and I return to the altar I usually consume what is left over? This isn't quite accurate, but I'll explain what we do and why. This has to do with what we believe about the bread and wine which have been consecrated during the Eucharistic Prayer.

Basically, we believe that Christ is present in them. Although, we don't go as far as to say the bread and wine are the actual body and blood, we do believe that in a miraculous way they are more than simple, everyday bread and everyday wine. Christ is in them. So, if we believe this, then we have to be very careful about how they're disposed of. We treat what is left over with the same care as we would treat Christ himself. It is not permitted to return the wine to the bottle it came from, or to pour it into the ground.

In the same way we are not permitted to put the hosts back in the container they came from or to feed them to birds. They have to be consumed straightaway or kept separate for use in other services or for home visits. We keep the consecrated bread and wine in an aumbry which is a small cupboard usually built into the wall near an altar. You may have noticed that some people genuflect towards the altar when they approach it, this is because of the presence of the consecrated elements in the aumbry.

There are obvious practical reasons why I have to be careful when consuming what is left of the wine, so I will sometimes leave what is left of the consecrated wine in a chalice for someone else to drink. Either way, the chalices have to be rinsed with water, water which is also consumed rather than poured away and this is so that as far as possible all of the wine has been drunk reverently. The crumbs left over from the hosts are also added to the wine and consumed. In this way as far as possible, the consecrated bread and wine are eaten or drunk in their entirety before the chalices and patten are washed.

Do you wonder why we do certain things in church? Please let me know and I'll try to explain.

LEAP YEAR MONEY BOX

As we say goodbye to February, how did you do with your Leap Year Money Box?

You may remember that on 29th February, to celebrate Leap Year (and to raise some much needed funds for church!) we launched the Leap Year Money Box. The idea was to save just one coin per day, any denomination of your choice, for the whole of the leap year, ending on 28th February 2025. Just one penny a day will give us £3.66! Five pence per day is £18.30, ten pence £36.60 You get the idea! 366 random (British) coins would be wonderful but whatever you are able to give would be so much appreciated and very much needed!
