

It doesn't seem long since we were gearing up for an unusual Advent and Christmas and now here we are in February preparing for Lent and Easter as difficult days continue. Last year, as the coronavirus pandemic was beginning to take hold throughout Lent, the phrase, "this is the Lent-iest Lent I have

ever Lent-ed" – it seems this year we are there once more.

This year, Lent will be marked differently. This is a wonderful opportunity for us all to be creative in finding ways to keep a holy Lent. We may think about reading a Lent book or making a special effort to pray at a certain time each day. We could make a special effort to count our blessings and to find ways to bless others – perhaps with a letter, phone call or gift. In all these things, recognise that God is with us, encouraging us, healing us and making us whole that we may continue to grow in love and do God's will looking forward to the day when we can rejoice and celebrate together.






WATER AID

Across the world, extreme weather makes accessing clean water even more difficult for the poorest people. Rain is becoming more unpredictable. Intense droughts are drying up wells and springs. Love Is...



As we mark Valentines' Day this month, it's good to ask the question: what does real love look like?

The Apostle Paul says: 'Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.' (1 Corinthians 13: 4-8).

Love is unconditional:

At heart, love is not just feelings but action! Paul talks here about unconditional love, using the word *agape*, which demonstrated in God's love for us: 'We love, because He first loved us.' (1 John 4:19).

Love is forgiving:

According to the film Love Story, 'Love means never having to say you're sorry.' This is rarely true in our experience! According to Paul, love is being ready to forgive others and 'keeping no record of wrongs' (5). We can only forgive others because we know God forgiveness in our own lives.

Love is sacrificial:

Paul says that agape love is not selfish or self-seeking, but selfless and self-sacrificial, putting the needs of other people first. This is modelled by Jesus giving His life for us on the cross. Take the words from 1 Corinthians and instead of the word *love*, substitute your own name. Now substitute the word *Jesus*. This is the Jesus who is available to you to make your love for others grow and flourish.

Someone once compared love being like a group of porcupines huddling together on a cold night. The closer they get, the more they jab and hurt each other. 'To love at all is to be vulnerable.' (C S Lewis).

Paws for thought



Love is in the air! February brings Valentine's Day and its another great day for my humans to show me how much they love me! I just know that I shall be showered with cuddles, love and kisses, tasty food and a lovely long walk...actually, it will just be like any other day of my life!

I know from being a Vicarage dog that whilst St Valentine may have overtaken the more secular market on 14th February, in the church calendar Ss Cyril and Methodius have their day.

Cyril and his older brother Methodius were born in Thessalonica and were great linguists. Cyril created the Slavonic alphabet and set about translating the Scriptures and liturgical texts into the language. They established the church in Moravia. Cyril died on 14th February 869 and Methodius returned to Moravia as archbishop, where he completed the translation of the Bible and continued the missionary work. He died in the year 885. They both did huge amounts of work creating understanding and communication between the eastern and western churches, helping Christians to love one another and work together.

We often hear about the "language of love". Is it a language of romantic hearts, chocolates, and expensive flowers or is it something more than that? Cyril and Methodius showed a love of God by encouraging good relationships, communication and understanding between people.

The past 12 months have seen us all have to rethink our means of communications – however we're in touch, let's show true love – which simply listens, cares, heals and unites.

Making sense of Lent

This month sees the start of Lent, the six-week period leading up to Easter. In the early Church, it was a time when new converts were instructed in the faith, ready for their baptism at Easter. Over the years, Lent has become a season of penitence, self-examination and fasting. Jesus began His earthly ministry by fasting in the wilderness for 40 days and taught his disciples to fast,

'when you fast..' (Matthew 6:17).

Fasting might involve missing one or two meals in a day, refraining from TV or alcohol, or whatever gets in the way of us fully focusing on God. What are the reasons for fasting?

- The act of giving up something is a tangible sacrifice to God, reminding us of our desire to put him first in our lives.
- Giving up things I value shows me how depend I can be on other things rather than God.
- Fasting helps me to surrender my 'idols' to God.
- When fasting I am reminded of a deeper hunger and need for God in my life: 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.' (Matthew 5:6). I learn to be more dependent on God, while releasing the stuff I depend on in my life.

Lent can also be a time to embrace new spiritual disciplines eg joining a study group, 'random acts of kindness', giving more time to prayer and Bible study Whatever you do, have a great Lent!

'Jesus takes it for granted that his disciples will observe the pious custom of fasting. Strict exercise of self-control is an essential feature of the Christian's life. Such customs have only one purpose - to make the disciples more ready and cheerful to accomplish those things which God would have done.' (Dietrich Bonhoeffer).
