The Vicar writes...

Change is beginning to happen now. Spring is emerging ever more determinedly by the day, the numbers of Covid 19 cases are decreasing, the number of those vaccinated is increasing and the sun has even been making more frequent appearances over the past few days! The past weeks of "lockdown" have been extremely challenging but

however small and still in the distance it seems now, hope is in sight. We look forward to the days when we can meet together again and fully embrace life and freedom.

One of the wonderful things that spring brings is a reminder of the speed with which the beauty of nature blossoms around us from tiny, seemingly insignificant shoots — from the dark and cold of winter and the hardness of the frozen ground there shoots forth new life and in the blinking of an eye flowers open and leaves unfold and appear on the trees. Birdsong has already picked up a pace as lighter days are heralded by a choir that certainly is still able to sing and praise God and the morning!

In his book, "Candles in the Dark", Rowan Williams writes of the first national "lockdown." 

Giving thanks for our vaccines!

From the Diocese of Manchester newsletter

The Diocese of Manchester has partnered with Christian Aid to give people an opportunity to give thanks for their Covid-19 vaccine and help others in crisis across the world.

Recognising the deep sense of relief and gratitude experienced by many people after being vaccinated, the two organisations have come together to enable people to pass the blessing on by making a donation to Christian Aid's Coronavirus Appeal.

Funds from the appeal are helping vulnerable communities around the world access soap, water, food and vital health information in the face of the pandemic. Many communities around the world face an uncertain wait for a vaccine as questions remain around the cost and timing of a global vaccine programme.

Christian Aid partners have so far directly helped over half a million people in 27 countries including distributing food packages to nearly 60,000 people struggling to feed their families after losing work during lockdown and the economic downturn.

Going forwards, Christian Aid will support vaccination programmes in communities by providing data on hard-to-reach populations to local health services and by working with trusted community figures to challenge misleading information about the virus and vaccination as well as any stigma faced by those who contract Covid-19.

Christian Aid's Head of Community Fundraising and Public Engagement Chine McDonald said: "The coronavirus pandemic has shown us that none of us are safe, until all of us are safe. It has been amazing to see the speed at which the vaccines have been rolled out in the UK – every jab in someone's arm brings us closer to the end of Covid-19.

"But the reality is that richer countries like ours are getting more access to vaccines, while the poorer countries in which Christian Aid works are left at the back of the queue. As a Christian organisation, we believe that every person is equal in the sight of God and worthy of living lives with dignity, equality and justice.

"We're delighted to work together with the Diocese of Manchester to give people an opportunity to say thanks and help protect our global neighbours while the vaccine is out of reach."


