The Vicar writes

This May continues to bring newness of life in many ways, not least with the potential lifting of more restrictions later in the month. The easing of restrictions means we can see family and friends outdoors. It also means that outdoors pastoral visits are possible too (up to 6 people and 2 households) in gardens, outside a coffee shop or on a walk. If you would like to arrange a visit, please do be in touch.

There is an increasing sense of hope moving forward. Our thoughts and prayers remain with communities and individuals across the world who continue to suffer the devastating effects of COVID 19.

Our lives which are emerging and being rebuilt are different to our lives when this all began; the world has changed, and our own attitudes and outlooks may have changed. The life of the church has changed too, locally and within our Diocesan context. In the Diocese of Manchester there are major changes underway as to how parishes and clergy will operate. At the start of June, the deanery of Ashton will merge with the deaneries of Oldham East and West to form one large deanery. A full time Area Dean of the new deanery, the Revd Daniel Ramble, will begin his post in June and future patterns of working in "Mission Communities" between parishes and clergy will be discerned and developed. Times have changed and are changing, and we do not yet fully know what that will mean. Newness of life is emerging and as we know, life means that change is inevitable. This can take great courage, and faith and trust in God.

The apostles gathered in uncertainty after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and after his Ascension into heaven – that had experienced great trauma and fast paced change. Uncertain of the way that lay before them, they continued to be faithful in prayer, in supporting one another and in the breaking of bread in remembrance of their Lord. It was into this gathering that the Holy Spirit came in tongues of flame to bring new life, God's life, to the church. Today God's Holy Spirit continues to be given to God's church, as a body and as individuals – the Holy Spirit is poured out to sustain, to enliven, and to make all things new. Like the apostles, we wait, we hope, we pray and we trust in God, who is our rock, our refuge and our strength.

"Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth."




